

end of the war and the world Jewish community is facing a new challenge; sooner than we would want, there will loss, they are at risk of falling into isolation and despair," be no more Survivors.

The truth is that all of the Holocaust survivors are old. Many survivors are dependent Jewish and social welfare. They are not living as well as they deserve to live. One day, not long from now, there will be no more Holocaust survivors left.

In a recent article, writer Matthew Fishbane notes that, "... one of the greatest risks of

Jewish life today is the smothering sentimentalization of Holocaust survivors are growing older and frailer. The our memory of the Shoah. The fact that any survived Auschwitz only to suffer at the end of their lives is appalling and embarrassing. These are painful things to think about, let alone say. And part of the uneasiness comes from the way wealthy and comfortable American Jews have used 'remembering the Holocaust' as the touchstone of their communal existence."

When a recent, highly publicized and debated Pew study asked, "What does being Jewish mean in America today?" an astonishing 73 percent of U.S. Jews replied that "remembering the Holocaust" was "essential to their sense of Jewishness." Another 69 percent also cited "leading an ethical life." More than half (56 percent) said that "working for justice and equality is essential to what being Jewish means to them." To U.S. Jews, more important than any other identifying factor was this daunting. Our challenge is even more serious; will we do bizarre enshrinement of memory.

He goes on to remind us that World War II ended nearly 70 years ago. Even accounting for those who lived through the war, as opposed to having directly suffered its most terrible expressions, the number of survivors still alive today across the world is probably in the low hundreds of thousands, and dwindling. Earlier this month, after an initiative announced by Vice President Joe Biden, the U.S. Senate's Special Committee on

In 2005, the U.N. declared that Aging noted in a hearing on Holocaust survivors that one January 27<sup>th</sup> of every year would fourth of the roughly 140,000 survivors in America live at be recognized as an International or below the poverty line. Some other estimates put Day to Remember the Victims of more than half of the survivors living in the United States the Holocaust. January 27th was below 200 percent of the Federal Poverty Level, meaning chosen because it was the day they earn less than \$21,660 annually. The problem is serious enough that last week, the Obama Administration named the first Special Envoy for U.S. Holocaust Survivor Services, charged with caring for this population. "Living in poverty, plagued by immeasurable Lee Sherman, the president of the Association of Jewish

> Family and Children's Agencies, told the Senate. According to Elihu Kover of Nazi Victim Services for Selfhelp Community Services, more than half of the thousands of survivors who live in New York City can be classified as "very poor" or "near poor" under federal guidelines.

> At the Senate hearing, Kover starkly: put it even more

twenty-year-old who survived Auschwitz is now eightyeight. She may be coping with the loss of her spouse and have no family to speak of. In addition to the myriad of problems associated with so-called "normal aging," many survivors have numerous physical and psychological problems directly attributable to their experiences during the Holocaust. Prolonged periods of starvation, exposure to severe weather conditions with inadequate clothing, and experiencing and witnessing unspeakable atrocities, take a severe toll on body and mind. And many of these problems only surface in old age, having been hidden during their working years when the survivors struggled and made a new life for themselves as productive citizens of this country.

The problems the survivors face are real and whatever we can to preserve their memory and, in doing so, preserve their dignity, their lives and their history? I pray we do, for we can do no less.

I was out recently with some of my parents' friends, when one of them pointed across the room and asked if I thought the guy with the brown curly hair was an M.O.T. Having never heard that acronym, I gave her a funny look and asked her to break it down for me. She chuckled and said, "M.O.T, Member of the Tribe, you know, one of us!"

February 7th - 9th, Rabbi Sid Schwarz, author of Jewish Megatrends: Charting the Course of The American Jewish Future, will be our Scholar-in-Residence. In addition to sharing his Jewish wisdom and insight, he will present findings from his book, which discusses the future of Judaism as it relates to Millennial (those born between 1980 and the early 2000's) engagement. In exploring the question of generational differences, Rabbi Schwarz presents what he identifies as a growing polarization between two types of Jews: "tribal Jews" and "covenantal Jews". Schwarz characterizes "tribal Jews" as those who identify strongly with Israel and who worry about threats to Jewish continuity and survival. These "tribal Jews" are the majority of adults and seniors in our Jewish community. It is how they were brought up and it is the lens through which they see their Judaism. "Covenantal Jews" are those of the younger generation who are less concerned with "the tribe" or "M.O.T.'s" and more focused on Jewish covenant, on social justice and tikkun olam. Schwarz argues that the "tribal Jews" are driving away the "covenantal Jews," the younger generation, because they do not understand Millennials' needs. Schwarz argues that Millennials need to be engaged from the "outside in approach," rather than from the "inside out approach." In other words, start with what matters to young adults, explore their secular concerns and passions, and help them find a way into Judaism through a connection to Jewish wisdom, literature and spirituality.

Listening to Rabbi Schwarz, I know you will agree with me that Temple Shalom is, in fact, engaging Millennials "where they are," from the "outside in." In our Next *Dor* program, our post b'nai mitzvah students choose from a variety of electives ranging from "JewTube" to "Krav Maga" to "Sex Ed". These electives begin with a secular topic, draw in the student and then create a Jewish connection. Teens walk away with Jewish knowledge and insight without it being "forced" through traditional text study. Thus, they are more likely to engage year to year.

The same means of engagement and education are applied whether you are a student in our K-7 program, Next *Dor* or are active in our Young Adult Connection (YAC) group. Our clergy and teachers are committed to Millennial engagement and continuously find creative ways to build connections and ties to Judaism.

I feel so lucky to be part of this community and have the opportunity to bridge the gap between two generations of Jews. We have so much to learn from one another and I look forward to continued engagement. You can find the details of our Scholar-in-Residence weekend on page 8 of the newsletter. # Scholar In Residence Rabbi Sid Schwarz Jewish Megatrends and Re-visioning the American Synagogue February 7 - 9



Rabbi Sid Schwarz has been a congregational rabbi, a social entrepreneur, the CEO of several non-profits and an author. He founded and led *PANIM: The Institute for Jewish Leadership and Values* for 21 years, an organization that is dedicated to inspiring, training and empowering Jewish youth to a life of leadership, activism and service. Dr. Schwarz previously served as the executive director of the Jewish Community Council of Greater Washington D.C. where he oversaw the public affairs and community relations work for the Jewish community. He is the founding rabbi of Adat Shalom Reconstructionist Congregation in Bethesda, MD, where he continues to teach and lead services. Dr. Schwarz holds a Ph.D. in Jewish history and is the author of more than 100 articles and three groundbreaking books, *Finding a Spiritual Home: How a New Generation of Jews Can Transform the American Synagogue* (Jewish Lights, 2000), *Judaism and Justice: The Jewish Passion to Repair the World* (Jewish Lights, 2006), and *Jewish Megatrends: Charting the Course of the American Jewish Future* Jewish Lights, 2013).

We'll head home Sunday, and arrive back in Dallas around dusk.



Munich lawyer Dr. Michael Siegel (1882-1979) had complained to Munich Police Headquarters in early April 1933 when one of his clients was taken into protective custody. He had the legs of his trousers cut off and was led through Munich's inner streets barefoot with a board around his neck that read, "I will never complain to the police again!" As late as 1940, Siegel managed to flee to Peru where he died in 1979.




