## *I Was Just Thinking...*



April is always that time of the year when we gear up not only for spring cleaning, but preparing our homes for Passover. Whether or not we are hosting a seder at our homes, we are required to search the innermost corners of our homes for chametz — the elements of leaven that must be removed in order that our homes are free from impurities. Custom has it that with feather, candle and spoon, crumbs

are gathered and then burned, in a testament that our places are a “chametz-free zone.” Whether or not you use a feather and spoon, or cleaning wipes and gloves, getting rid of the elements of the previous year in order to be prepared for the moment of redemption that Passover holds for us is a vital part of the experience of becoming free people.

The Seder experience is a really powerful one, filled with all kinds of symbols, both ancient and more modern: with family memories, family recipes, family traditions, and customary blessings, readings and prayers. The Haggadah informs us that it is incumbent upon each participant to feel as if he/she was personally freed from Egypt and that anyone who elaborates and enhances the Passover experience – Harei Ze Meshubach – they are deserving of praise. These are two of my favorite lines from the Haggadah as we journey toward redemption.

But in all honesty, I wasn’t freed from slavery in Egypt – none of us in 2016 were. Not in the literal sense, anyway. So if it doesn’t really work on the literal level, what about the metaphorical? Well, to begin, we must remember that the Haggadah is a tool to allow us to understand and experience redemption (more on that in a moment). Also, the word Egypt also has a meaning of “restrictive” or “narrow” and in that sense, I believe we can all think of an experience in which we have been redeemed from a narrow or restrictive place and/or experience. Just as our ancestors were redeemed from their Egypt in space, we can be redeemed from our Egypt of time.

Of the many things the Haggadah attempts to redeem us from — Hunger (“This is the bread of affliction. Let all who are hungry come in and eat...”), Physical bondage (“Our ancestors were slaves unto Pharaoh...”), Spiritual bondage (“In the beginning our ancestors were idol worshippers...”), Rootlessness (“My ancestors were wandering Arameans...”), Ignorance (“Rabban Gamliel taught that whoever does not know the three symbols of Passover has not fulfilled the obligation...”), Foreign Oppressors (“...Then came the Holy One, who killed the Angel of death...Chad Gadya...”), and Separation from God (“Who knows One...”) — in the end, the Haggadah fails to get us to ultimate redemption, because we end the seder with “Next Year in Jerusalem”. We might have

come close, but no cigar. As beautiful as the seder might be, we fell short – as we do every single year (and I thought being a Cleveland Indians fan was tough!). What are we not doing that keeps us from final redemption?

Perhaps it might be that the levels of redemption in the Haggadah are not universally experienced. We have much work to do to help others out of their Egypt experiences. Perhaps. I actually think it has to do with chametz – all that leaven we are not allowed to eat and must get rid of before the holiday begins. This too operates on both the literal and metaphoric levels.

Chametz is not just leavened food stuff, the word means to puff up or expand. We may get rid of the food products that do not fit into someone’s understand of Kosher for Passover, but unless and until we get rid of that which puffs us up and makes our heads and egos too big, we will never be fully redeemed. And we in the Jewish community have to be the examples. When we use words or ideas that puff us up and

thereby put other people down, when we support ideas and ideals that marginalize and peripheralize others, when we think that others do not deserve the rights that we enjoy because they are not deserving for some reason or another, when we become so obtuse from our puffiness to the feelings and experiences of others, then not only have we not fulfilled our Passover responsibilities, we have not fulfilled our PRIMARY Jewish responsibility – to remember that we were slaves

– strangers in a strange land. If we were such and are commanded thirty-six times to remember that experience as the Torah relates, then in no way can we allow ourselves or others to perpetrate that on our world. The fact that we are not redeemed is evidence of the fact that we have much more work to do to get rid of the chametz epidemic. If we don’t take the lead, each of us, individually, then we cannot be surprised by our leaders who display the worst of this and wonder how did our world get like that?

While I struggle every year to determine what is chametz and what is not, what is edible and what is not, I do not struggle with knowing I have much that puffs me up to toss on the garbage pile. How effective I am each year is something I measure as I come to the spring cleaning anew. By the way, ever wonder why we burn the chametz when we find it with our feathers, spoons and candles? Because burning it is like a sacrifice; we offer these sins to God who we hope will take them away and transform them from that which fills us up to that which might fill the world up with God’s blessing, God’s spirit and God’s glory. Then, and only then, will we be redeemed and experience really being in Jerusalem!

Chag Sameach – Happy Passover to you and yours.

## ***A Note from Cantor Devorah Avery***



In an article I read during cantorial school called, "The Vocation of the Cantor," Abraham Joshua Heschel speaks of music and its vital importance in worship. Heschel takes the existence of music in our lives as proof of the presence of God in our world. He says, "The only language that seems to be compatible with the wonder and mystery of being is the language of music." Heschel continues by saying, "Music is more than just expressiveness. It is rather a reaching out toward a realm that lies beyond the reach of verbal propositions."

Another well-known man, Woody Guthrie, speaks of the eternal aspect of music and how music is a part of everything on Earth. He said, "Music is in all the sounds of nature and there never was a sound that was not music - the splash of an alligator, the rain dripping on dry leaves, the whistle of a train, a long and lonesome train whistling down, a truck horn blowing at a street corner speaker - kids squawking along the streets - the silent wail of wind and sky caressing the breasts of the desert."

Though worded in completely different ways and hitting on different aspects of music, both men take something intangible, something felt, something inner and mysterious, and manage to put into beautiful words, the feeling of music. In my role as Cantor, I want people to feel about music and prayer the way I do, the way Heschel and Guthrie described it, and I want them to experience it here at Temple Shalom. I try to achieve this through my choice of music for services, and, in the future, I hope to achieve this through different musical programming.

For my Installation as Cantor at Temple Shalom, we will have a special musical Shabbat service. We will have three guest musicians from out of town: Cantor David Goldstein, Senior Cantor of North Shore Congregation Israel, (who will be installing me as cantor); Dina Pruzhnasky, composer and Accompanist from Temple Israel of Northern Westchester; and Edward Pleasant, Choir Director of Temple Israel of Northern Westchester. Our very own Cantor Don Croll will also be participating in the music of the service. We will have our Adult Choir participating as well. It should be a musically beautiful and spiritually uplifting Shabbat service.

My goal for the future is to have a music program that Temple Shalom can be proud of, built on the successes of the past. We have already started rebuilding the Youth Choir and renamed it *Ruach*. We have some spirited youth singing in it. If you were at the Purim Spiel, you got a little taste of their beautiful singing.

I need the help of the community in order to reinvigorate our music program. A few of the new implementations I'd love to make are the following: I want us to have special musical Shabbat services a few times per year, have the choirs participate in Shabbat Services, and I'd love to create a Sunday afternoon concert series. There is so much that can be done here, so much more that is possible.

You can get involved by participating in the Adult Choir or having your child participate in *Ruach*. I am hoping to build a Temple T'filah band, so please let me know if this is something you'd like to be involved in.

If getting involved by participating in music isn't your thing, but you would like to get involved somehow, making a donation to the Music Fund would be deeply appreciated. Your help can make a difference.

## Temple Shalom Spotlight Congregant of the Month

*As part of getting to know our congregation, each month we feature a different Temple Shalom congregant.*

### The Eichelbaum Family

#### ***Please introduce your family.***

Our family consists of Dennis and Julie Eichelbaum, daughters Bari (23), Emma (21), and our son Aaron (17).

#### ***When did you join Temple Shalom?***

When Passover comes around, we spend a lot of time talking about freedom: the freedom from slavery, freedom from servitude, freedom from Egypt. We celebrate the miracle of our release, our new-found liberation and brand-new life. During the seder, we sing joyous songs and recall the story of our Exodus. However, while we recline, eat delicious food, and try to stomach as much matzah as possible, we often miss a crucial message of the Passover holiday. Yes, those of us fortunate enough to live in America have freedom of religion, freedom of speech, and so on. We are no longer slaves and we can earn an income without doing back-breaking work. However, in a less explicit way, we are still slaves; still chained and restrained from living fully liberated lives. Whether it is the stress we carry day to day, the negative feelings we hold onto, or the grief we just cannot overcome, many of us feel restricted from living fully.

Additionally, while not necessarily relevant for adults, many of our children have become slaves to technology. They find it almost impossible to power down a cell phone or lap top and have begun to lose important social skills because of their dependency on technology. As parents and grandparents, this is worrisome. Because these burdens restrict us from living our lives fully, our lifelong learning staff has decided to address each of these areas in depth as part of our *Intergenerational Day of Learning* to be held on Sunday, April 17<sup>th</sup> from 9:30am-12:00pm. During this time, we will explore what it means to be a slave to an emotion, mindset, or materialistic item, and discover ways of liberating ourselves. On April 17<sup>th</sup> we will begin with an opening session from 9:30am-10:00am and then will break into groups depending on your topic preference. Following breakout sessions, we will gather for brunch, and then, at 11:30am, we will join the entire religious school for a musical service and Passover sing-along. Our *Intergenerational Day of Learning* is open to all adults in our Temple Shalom community, including parents of students in the religious school. It is sure to be a wonderful morning filled with learning, skill building, food and fun. 

### **Three Images of the Emerging Modern Jew through the works of Christopher Marlowe, William Shakespeare, and Francis Bacon**

Three renowned early-modern writers educated fellow Englishmen about how Jews could leave the ghetto and enter modern life, and why non-Jews should welcome them. Christopher Marlowe's play, *The Jew of Malta* (1590), starts out looking like a Jew-bashing, but ends up bashing Christians and Muslims equally — on the Machiavellian (atheist) premise that religious differences are not worth fighting over, even though (or just because) political glory is. In contrast, Shakespeare's *The Merchant of Venice* (1596), shows how Jews and Christians can flourish together only by living up to the shared moral teachings of the Bible — as, admittedly, neither the play's Christian merchant Antonio, nor its Jewish moneylender Shylock quite does. Finally, Francis Bacon's dialogue *New Atlantis* (1626), shows how a high-tech utopia run by scientists requires religious tolerance, by including a politically-wise Jew (resembling say, Bernard Baruch or Henry Kissinger) with an indispensable role in the ruling inner-circle. Professor Yaffe will compare these three images of the Jew and their present-day relevance.
