I Was Just Thinking...



I am not sure why, but June and July always feel different than May and August. Perhaps it is a result of the rigor and grind of the academic year that drives our sense of time; perhaps it is the business cycles of the May 31st fiscal year ends for some; perhaps it is the fact that May often coincides with Shavuot, the last of the Festivals we celebrate; perhaps it is a combination of all of these things. To be sure, this June feels different most

profoundly for me because Cantor Croll is now our Cantor Emeritus, and Rabbi Ariel Boxman is our new Rabbi, who will be directing our Jewish educational efforts. With the changes in our staff team, the summer time is both an opportunity to relax and recharge, and at the same time imagine and dream of the future and the continued great things that are in store for Temple Shalom. I, for one, will definitely be doing both!

As with any kind of change, be it seasonal or age related, careers or perspectives, change definitely comes, perhaps slowly, perhaps not, and allows us a moment or two to ponder what the new scene looks like, what it feels like and how we will respond to it. It gives us a chance to reflect on our lives and to ask important questions that only we can answer. It poses existential questions which we must answer in order to move forward in a healthy, productive way. What I hope for is captured in the phrase we use when we return the Torah to the Ark. Having heard God's word and perhaps learned something new of God's plan for us, we say, "*Hashiveinu Adonai eleicha, v'nashuva. Chadeish yameinu k'kedem*" - "Return us to You, Adonai, and we shall return. Make our days new again as before." Think of it as the original slogan that Kellogg's Corn Flakes adopted a few years back when they came up with the ad campaign, "Corn Flakes - Try them again for the first time."

version of me, devoid of the knowledge and mistakes, the relationships and accomplishments. So, as you can imagine, I have been thinking about this and I came across a question via a really great song that I am sure many have asked in various ways over time. If you came to the annual meeting this year, you saw a glimpse of it at the end of the video montage. The question that percolated for me was, "How's your life today?" It's simple, it's familiar and it is critically important at this juncture in our lives to ask it and be honest about our

answers and thoughtful about what we are going to do with what we discover. This will be our Congregational Learning Theme for the new year and the summer is the perfect time to begin thinking about the answers, since Rosh Hashanah is September 4th!

So...How's your life today? How have the changes in your family, your career, your school, your children, your spouse/partner/significant other, your community, your neighborhood, your Temple, your city, your state, your country, your world affected you? What's different? What's the same? What matters most? Think about it. I know I will be. And if you get stuck, a little prayer to God never hurts, for God indeed will return you to your Source of the Divine and there you will find everything you need.
