## I Was Just Thinking...



## How is your life today?

It has been a little more than a year since I first posed this question to our congregation during last year's annual meeting and then again during the High Holy Days. I asked this question both as a way of

reflecting on the changes at Temple Shalom at the time – Cantor Croll retiring and Rabbi Boxman coming to Temple Shalom – as well as a way of reflecting on the goings on of our own lives as a way of looking forward to the future, which I am always excited to do. Without reviewing every peak and

valley we crossed, we come now to the point in our year to pause and assess, once again, how we did and where we are in order to chart where we might yet go.

As with any kind of change, be it seasonal, or age related; careers or perspectives, change definitely comes, perhaps slowly, perhaps not, and allows us a moment or two to

ponder what the new scene looks like, what it feels like and how we will respond to it. It gives us a chance to reflect on our lives and to ask important questions that only we can answer. It poses existential questions to which we must answer in order to move forward in a healthy, productive way. What I hope for is captured in the phrase we use when we return the Torah to the Ark. Having heard God's word and perhaps learned something new of God's plan for us, we say, "Hashiveinu Adonai eleicha, v'nashuva. Chadeish yameinu k'kedem" -"Return us to You, Adonai, and we shall return. Make our days, new again as before." Think of it as the original slogan that Kellogg's Corn Flakes adopted a few years back when they came up with the ad campaign, "Corn Flakes - Try them again for the first time."

What I am praying for is not a return to my youth, as interesting as it may have been. I don't want to go through those experiences again, thank you very

much, once was plenty. I am not praying for a younger version of me, devoid of the knowledge and mistakes, the relationships and accomplishments. I am not praying for a clean slate because forgetting the past, or worse, not having one, devalues the present and makes meaningless the experiences that got us here to where we are. No, I am not thinking for any of those things when I say, *Hashiveinu Adonai eleicha, v'nashuva. Chadeish yameinu k'kedem.* What I am praying for is for God to renew in me the passions, the energy, the desires, the thrills, the excitement, the radical amazement and the awe that I, and perhaps others as well, felt in days gone by. It is not to suggest in

It is not to suggest in any way that I don't feel those feelings every day; rather, I pray to God to return me to my Divine source, which God gave to me, in order that I be able to do my work in the world. So, how's your life today? It's simple, it's familiar and it is critically important at this juncture in our lives to ask it and be honest about our

answers and thoughtful about what we are going to do with what we discover. We asked it last year at this time and, as we close out this academic year, I find it pertinent to ask it once more. So...How's your life today? How have the changes in your family, your career, your school, your children, your spouse/ partner/significant other, your community, your neighborhood, your Temple, your city, your state, your country, your world affected you? What's different? What's the same? What matters most? Think about it. I know I will be. And, if you get stuck, a little prayer to God never hurts, for God indeed will return you to your Source of the Divine and there you will find everything you need.

Have a wonderful, safe, thoughtful and most importantly, restful summer.

### And the survey says....

A few years ago, Temple Shalom surveyed the congregation on a variety of topics with respect to interest and satisfaction. As for the survey response, 388 surveys were completed, and multiple focus groups were also surveyed. Two thirds of all respondents rated their satisfaction with Temple Shalom in the top two buckets (out of seven). It's time to look back at the specific results, and the steps taken since that address the results.

Congregational life and leadership was an area in which some congregants sought more participation. As a result of the survey, further emphasis was placed on our committees and councils, and we currently have seen a significant increase in congregational involvement with committees. We have increased participation, especially for young adults, by opening up the Havurah program to new Havurot, many of which involve young adults.

As young adults was (and remains) an area of focus listed by the survey, Temple invested both time and money into young adults connections and programming. Rabbi Boxman has led much of the effort and has a core group of young adults that meets regularly. The Board sent two congregants to Chicago to participate in the first conference on URJ Emerging Young Adult Initiatives. We are making strides in opening our congregation to increased young adult participation.

Our survey also addressed our staffing model, with an emphasis on education and music. The V'Ahavta Initiative reemphasized our congregation's commitment to lifelong learning being not simply a *right* but essential to the future of Judaism. Music was reinstituted and refocused this year into our religious school curriculum, and will grow and expand even more this coming year.

Our congregation's thanks cannot be repeated enough to Raelaine Radnitz, Josh Goldman, and all the members who have served on the Search Committee. They deserve the bulk of the credit for finding and securing Rabbi Boxman to reinvigorate our lifelong learning and bringing an exciting new and additional perspective to our worship; the Dallas Cowboys and Mavericks would declare it a banner year if they finished a draft with such a versatile and transformative player! And, while the Search Committee did not find a similar fit for the second position they were hoping to fill, we are thankful that they maintained the highest degree of selectivity and never settled. We will continue to assess our needs as we begin the new fiscal year, evaluating our next steps. Meanwhile, Cantor Glassman will be returning for the High Holy Days and will join us several additional weekends, and we have secured the part-time services of Rabbinic Intern Michael Harvey, who will bring his many talents to Temple Shalom to complement our All Star clergy team.

We are pleased to have been able to implement the needs as determined by our congregation's input, and to do so in a fiscally responsible manner with a balanced budget. While most congregations nationwide are seeing drops in membership, our congregation's decreases have leveled off and we actually had more members this May than the previous May. One of the survey's staffing recommendations that hoped to improve membership was a marketing position, which the Board budgeted, and whose work can be seen regularly in our TJP advertisements, Dallas Morning News coverage, and in all our publications. Our congregation is stronger due to our community's input, and additional and increased opportunities for input are scheduled this coming year.





## Lifelong Learning Council



In his book titled, *The Social Church*, Justin Wise attempts to understand how the influx of social media and technology has changed the way we engage with one another and with our religious institutions. Wise playfully calls this new generation, the "It's Mine, and It's About Me" generation. He writes: "*This value* [of customization] is rooted in the reality that we can customize everything as a new media generation. When I was growing up, the very first CD I bought was Jock Rock Volume 1. I bought it for one song only, "Blitzkrieg Bop" by The Ramones. I had to buy the whole CD in order to get that one song. Of course now, the New Media Culture knows that they can just go to iTunes and only buy the one song they like. They don't have to buy the whole album. This type of customization typifies the "It's Mine, It's About Me" value. It is less about self-centeredness and egotism more of creating a world in which one wants to live in."

As Wise so wisely points out, if we do not change the way we, churches and synagogues engage with our congregants, we will lose them. If we can customize everything from I-pods to sneakers to cell phone cases, why can't we customize our Judaism? Customize what we learn, the way we learn, where we learn, etc.?

In reflecting on this and brainstorming our future here at Temple Shalom, Rabbi Paley and I have come up with an idea for customized Jewish learning here in our own congregation. In addition to offering our traditional Torah study classes and occasional educational series, we are excited to announce the kick off of *Concierge Judaism: Bringing Adult and Family Learning Home to You*. In this exciting program, congregants will be able to choose, from an education catalogue, classes and experiences that interest them and their families. Volunteer instructors will teach from the comfort of your home or office and will create a customized learning experience based on what you and family and friends want to learn. In addition to Rabbi Paley and myself, the course offerings will be taught by Temple Shalom congregants and community members who have special talents or interests.

Classes offered range from challah baking to mystical text study. From Israeli wine tasting to Jewish family bedtime rituals. There will be something for everyone, whether it be a private session with your family, your Havurah or just a group of friends.

While we are still in the planning process, I would like to extend an invitation to anyone interested in being a volunteer Concierge Judaism instructor. Please send me a short blurb about what you might be interested in teaching and I will be in touch to secure the details. Keep in mind that classes are stand-alone and should range from 1-2 hours (max). Teaching times are arranged between the requesting party and the instructor, and all fees (for supplies) are covered by the learners.

Think about your special skills, interests, and knowledge and how it may be applied in a Jewish context. If you are unsure of your proposal, please let me know and I am happy to help! We plan to distribute our Concierge Judaism course catalogue in time for the High Holy Days, so please be in touch ASAP!




