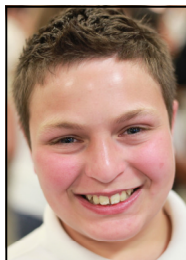

I Was Just Thinking...



Now that Sammy has become a Bar Mitzvah, there is a little room to be reflective about that accomplishment and the time that is upon us as we prepare to enter into a new year. On behalf of Debbie, Molly, Sammy and myself, we thank you for sharing in our day, if you were able, and for the wishes of Mazel and joy.

It was a wonderful weekend to share with our family and congregation.

I have been thinking a lot lately about what I tell Bar and Bat Mitzvah students about the meaning of the day and the title as I understand it. The more I tell it, the more I believe it and the more important its message becomes. What I tell all my students is what I told Sammy and Molly and remind myself every single day.

As many of you know, I consider myself an optimist, a glass more-than-half-full kind of person in almost every situation. As part of the “me generation,” I am guilty of the desire for immediate gratification. It has taken me a long time to be patient and try to see the bigger pictures in life and in the heavens, but I think I got pretty good at it. So, it is with this perspective that I share with students that, while I am a lover of Torah and the Hebrew Bible, of prayers and blessings, and of the commentaries and interpretations of our tradition, I am not overly concerned about how much a student does in this beginning stage of his/her Jewish journey. Quantity is not my issue. My issue with students, with myself, and frankly, with our communities at large, is our commitment that we make to **TRY** our hardest in the various endeavors of our lives, Judaism included. Being an optimist, I believe that if and when we try, and by that I mean REALLY try, we will be, more often than not, REALLY successful. But here's the rub: What does it mean to REALLY try? This was the question Sammy posed to me, proving, once again, how sharp and insightful he is, as one of the few students to ask that question.

In reflecting upon this, I have come to believe that we are in a bit of a crisis when it comes to trying. As a child, I remember problem solving to be a challenge. My parents did not run to my rescue whenever I was stumped about something. The mantra I heard was, “...figure it out.” It wasn't a parental copout but rather

a sage piece of wisdom that allowed me to be creative and somewhat self-reliant in my solutions. I keep my grandfather's giant dictionary in my office as a reminder of this ideal. “Look it up,” as I was commanded over and over, is a great skill to learn.

I wonder if we need a theology of trying. That is, a divine context in which we are reminded of the power to put forth a serious effort to be successful in the various tasks in which we are involved. Without trying to sound overly simple, I think we know the difference between sort of trying and really trying. There are serious problems facing our world right now with serious consequences if we fail to engage – really engage. The frustrating part to the problem of our world is that they are solvable – if we really try. God has endowed us with tremendous capacity for creativity and problem solving. If only we try...

I believe the theology is already in front of us. The Torah is replete with examples of characters who put forth various levels of trying. The most successful is Moses. That guy REALLY tried and was successful in getting the people where they needed to be. Over a lifetime of trying, he was successful. He had setbacks and very bad days but, in the end, it worked. Elijah the prophet, on the other hand, failed miserably at trying to be a prophet and barely tried to do what he was tasked to do and, as a result, God had him demoted. To me the picture is clear: when we put forth a consistent and significant effort to do God's will, to try our hardest as humans to accomplish the commandments in front of us trying to perfect our world, in the end and in the long run, we will be successful. My faith assures me of this. Whether we are trying in our sports, our music, our vocations, our relationships or in our Judaism, God demands that we REALLY try every day. When that happens we, undoubtedly, will be REALLY successful. It's hard work, frustrating work. But, it does result in unbelievable rewards. I look forward to a wonderful year of trying – together!

I have been called a contrarian before, and maybe it is true. I was always the one in Religious School who asked the question that exasperated the teacher. I was the one, when buying trees for Israel, who recognized that no one cared who the trees were actually named for, so I bought one in Yassir Arafat's name.

I think challenging conventional thinking is one of the things that most makes me feel Jewish-to-the-bone. One that always flummoxed me was Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur – if we have already been sealed in the book of life, why do we have to go through it every year (are there multiple books)? Do we each have our own book, or, if we do something wrong, does that somehow break the seal for everyone?

That is why I have always loved teaching Sunday School. I love the questions students ask; I love when they challenge conventional and traditional thinking. I love the answers we get from what we thought were obvious questions, like, when Rabbi Roseman once asked a group of young children which was the most important animal in the Garden of Eden, and one child replied “the otter.” To me, teaching our children at Temple Shalom has been the most enjoyable and rewarding aspect of my membership and involvement.

If you would consider teaching a class on a part of Judaism you love, please talk with Rabbi Boxman. Our Next *Dor* program was originally designed to offer multiple choices to our teens, similar to a group of college electives. Jewish cooking; Jews in comic books; Jewish choices; Jewish medical ethics; Jewish influences in rock & roll; the Holocaust; the meaning of prayer...if you have the background or an interest in it, we might be able to make a one hour course of it (8 weeks)! We are always looking for interesting subjects that will entice our children to continue their Jewish education and make Jewish learning fun! You will probably find it even more rewarding than the students.

Please think about it. Let's make Temple Shalom's Next *Dor* program the envy of every congregation, a program in which children cannot wait to become a B'nai Mitzvah so they can participate in Next *Dor*.

CONSTITUTION EVOLUTION

With the recent war in Gaza, the countries, companies, and organizations boycotting and withdrawing support for Israel, and the continual antagonistic rhetoric within and by the United Nations and a former president, the Board took up the issue of whether we should unequivocally express our view supporting Israel's right to exist.

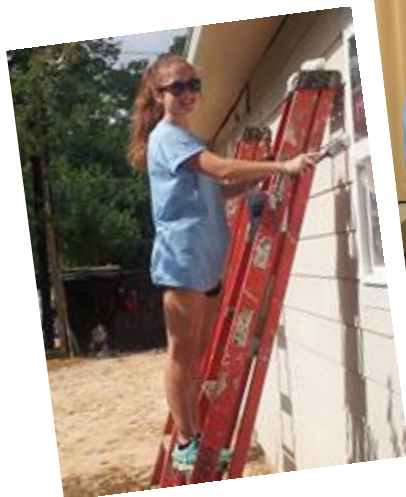
It is with such support that the Temple Shalom Board of Directors voted to bring to the congregation an amendment to Temple Shalom's Mission Statement, found in Article 2 of our Constitution, as follows:

MISSION STATEMENT: To inspire in our congregation an enduring relationship with God, Torah, Israel and the Jewish people through communal worship, study, gathering and community service.

Congregants each have their own opinions with respect to various issues involving the current State of Israel, and some may agree with the recent criticisms. Creating “an enduring relationship” doesn't define the context or the parameters of the relationship. Rather, we feel it is our responsibility as an educating institution to provide our congregants with learning so that they can create their own enduring relationship. As a Board, we do not say what that relationship should be, and just like all of our own relationships, there are times within them that we agree or disagree. Nonetheless, it is our job to inspire congregants to *have* a relationship with Israel.

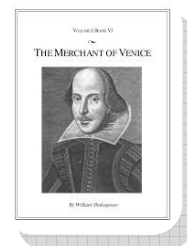


Martin Yaffe, UNT Professor of Philosophy
