I Was Just Thinking...



On November 9th, at Temple Shalom, I implore you to join with your fellow Temple Shalom-ites for, what will undoubtedly be, an amazing day as we will come together for this year's Synaplex™ entitled, "Why Israel Matters". This event, providing

learning, worship and hands-on experiences for the whole family, is designed to help us understand, appreciate and deepen our love for Israel and all that she has created and meant for us and the world. I want to thank our Synaplex™ committee for their wonderful hard work and dedication in creating this important learning opportunity.

As I was considering *why Israel matters*, and why we should bring this message to our congregation, I was amazed at the myriad of inventions and contributions Israel has brought to our world. I felt pride and admiration for the ingenuity, creativity and resourcefulness that it takes to make a desert bloom and thrive. I am awed by the resilience and the toughness it takes to be a bright light in an otherwise dark and desperately bad neighborhood, in which Israel finds herself. But a nagging question persists: Why does this matter?

Israel is not the only country who has contributed amazing things to the world and to world history; her people are not the only ones who have persisted and thrived against overwhelming odds; her story of survival and hope is not the only one out there. While all of this may be true, in my heart of hearts I know that Israel matters to me and to the Jewish people in a way that other countries do not. And it has to do with one concept that must be a part of the story told about Israel – **Peoplehood**.

Peoplehood. Israel matters because Israel is not just about geography; it is about DNA. It is about family, it is about Jewish consensus, it is about community, it is about history, it is about spirit. These are the elements that hold the Jewish people together and make us different from everyone else. We don't

talk enough about Jewish **Peoplehood**. Why is that? Is it because in the 21st century there is no longer a definitive way in which we, as a people, look? Since we look so differently from one another, how can we be considered a people? Is this the issue? Is it because the lines between us and them are blurry? Maybe. Is the difficulty in talking about Jewish **Peoplehood** a result in realizing that our politics are no longer the same? That there is no longer such a thing as a Jewish political consensus? Perhaps. Is the difficulty about **Peoplehood** a difficulty in thinking about community above individualism? That we tend to think transactionally about our institutions, rather than the absolutisms of belonging? Absolutely. Is the difficulty of talking about Jewish **Peoplehood** a result

of the serious diminishment of our connection to the land of Israel, its history and spiritual power? Most assuredly. Nevertheless, perhaps because of these issues and certainly in spite of them, must we make front and center the issue that Jewish **Peoplehood** matters to the

Jewish people because we are different; we see things differently, we feel things differently, we respond to the world differently and we create solutions for humanity differently, and frankly, more often than not, better.

There are many models of Jewish **Peoplehood** arising from Jewish sources which I will explore over the next several months in this column. For me, Jewish **Peoplehood** is expressed most acutely on an emotional, visceral level; that Jews are emotionally connected on a deep level. Jews, for me, are connected automatically and immediately. Jews, no matter where they live, or who they are, most definitely are different limbs of the same body. If one part of the body aches, the other part of the body feels it. I don't know what **Peoplehood** means to you, but I hope we will struggle together to find out.

When I was in high school, my younger brother, Adam, gave me a wood carving he had made at camp with a wonderful, encouraging, inquisitive statement – “Never be afraid to ask the question, ‘Why?’” This thought continues to motivate me, and I expand that thought by pondering, “Never be afraid to ask, ‘Why not?’”

What can we accomplish when we are unafraid of the questions, “Why?” and “Why not?” We can further explore the meaning of each Torah portion. We can encourage each other to find our own greatness; we can help each other through challenges and share in each other’s successes. We can support and be supported; we can listen and we can talk. We can be teachers and learners.

What can we accomplish when we are unafraid of the questions “Why?” and “Why not?” We **have** accomplished a tremendous amount and our willingness to ask “Why?” and “Why not?” will lead us toward further greatness. I look forward to posing these questions with you and exploring the answers that have not yet been discovered.

In the most recent issue of *Reform Judaism Magazine*, our very own Temple Shalom was highlighted for being one of the few congregations in the country who have successfully re-imagined the Post B'nei Mitzvah Experience. Our Next *Dor* program with its unique four pillar experience (education, worship, *tikkun olam*, and community) has not only increased our post-B'nei Mitzvah retention rate but has provided our students with an opportunity to develop personal and meaningful Jewish journeys during their high school tenure. In reviewing our registration numbers for this year, I am happy to report that our 8th grade is bigger than ever, with almost 100% retention PLUS a few more! While I cannot take credit for the success of our Next *Dor* program, I am so proud to inherit it and have an opportunity to continue developing it.

Our Next *Dor* program enables teens in 8th-12th grade to shape their personal Jewish journey, engage meaningfully with an adult mentor, and discover passions and interests as they develop and mature. In doing so, teens are encouraged to explore Judaism and engage spiritually, mentally and emotionally.

In thinking about the success of Next *Dor*, I have started to brainstorm ways that this model of "concierge Judaism" can be implemented in other areas of congregational life. How can we, at Temple Shalom, aid those in our community in shaping their individual Jewish journeys (wherever they may be on the path)? Like we do with the teens, how can we address the interests and passions of our adults, seniors and families and provide educational and cultural experiences that inspire and enrich?

Over the next few months, I will be working with Rabbi Paley, Howard Gottlieb and Beri Schwitzer on developing new and exciting Adult/Family Education programs that will allow for the "concierge" experience and the development of individual and family journeys based on unique interests and passions. If you have ideas or input to share, please email or call me anytime. I am always excited to hear your thoughts and brainstorm together.

With Thanksgiving and Hanukkah approaching later this month, I want to wish everyone a happy and healthy holiday filled November and share my personal thanks to everyone in the community who has welcomed me to Temple Shalom and Dallas so warmly.

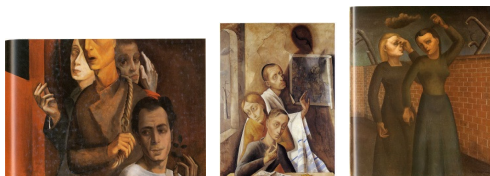

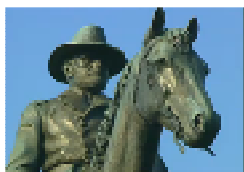

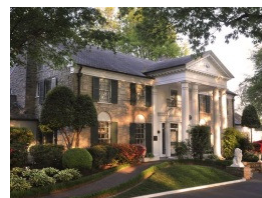
Adult Ed Trip with Rabbi Boxman to Vicksburg, Natchez and Memphis to Discover Southern Jewish Life and Enjoy the Music ***April 24 – 27, 2014***



We've planned an active, invigorating trip packed with education, inspiration, music and, of course, food of the Jewish and spiritual south. If you're an adventurous adult with lots of stamina and a great sense of humor, please consider joining us!

We'll travel by luxury bus, leaving early Thursday morning and visiting the battlefield at Vicksburg, Mississippi and a Jewish cemetery adjacent to the field.

This will be followed by a visit to Natchez, Mississippi, the home of the Museum of the Institute for Southern Jewish Life, housed in Temple B'nai Israel. We'll then head to Indianola, Mississippi and tour the B.B. King Museum and meet with Steve Rosenthal, Mayor of Indianola. Then, on to Cleveland, Mississippi for a visit to Adath Israel, where Rabbi Boxman will lead us in a Shabbat Service. We'll wake up in Memphis, Tennessee, and tour Graceland, the National Civil Rights Museum, The Belz Museum of Asian and Jewish Art, and Sun Records, the home of the Million Dollar Quartet. Of course, we'll make frequent stops at restaurants to enjoy good southern food!



We'll head home Sunday, and arrive back in Dallas around dusk.

We've reserved a block of rooms at special rates at the Hampton Inn in Natchez and the Springhill Suites in Memphis. We'll provide you with the information to reserve your room, once your deposit to cover the transportation, guides and tour operator is paid.
