# I Was Just Thinking...



As Jews and people of faith we know that symbols have meaning and we know that there are ideas that are bigger than any one person, worth not just believing in, but fighting for. Words like liberty, equality, freedom, honor, Constitution, republic, democracy need to mean something more than they did last year. Those words and the institutions they support are what drove the revolution from England, the formation of our country and inspire us to transcend the particular moment in which we find ourselves into something better and something brighter.

This is perhaps what Ronald Reagan was thinking when he described America as a "Shining city on a hill" – an America for all to see and emulate. Reagan, of course, borrowed this image from John Winthrop, the Governor of the Massachusetts Bay Colony, who spoke of that colony as a "city on a hill" in his 1630 sermon, "A Model of Christian Charity".

As Americans we have always desired and agreed to want to be that shining country on the hill and have always argued vociferously about how to do it. From the beginning of the American experiment, foreign visitors noted a key difference between the United States and its European kin. It was not held together by blood or custom. Its citizens had no common history going back to the ancients. They spoke different languages and worshipped in different ways. What constituted America, these observers argued, were ideas. Americans agree to a surprising degree about which symbols and ideas are central to our national life, but we disagree profoundly about what these symbols and ideas mean and how they ought to be translated into public policies. The fights Americans have about who has stolen America and who is going to take it back focus, to be sure, on keywords such as "liberty" and "equality"—on the ideas that energized the new nation and, for a time, rent it asunder. But this conversation is also inspired by key phrases—"a city on the hill," "We the people," "one nation, under God," "I have a dream"—and by inescapable speeches, songs, and stories that carry these words and phrases down through the generations. Finally, and most important, America's conversation about itself is fueled by passion. And we have seen a lot of it as I pray we always will.

America is not any one thing at any one time; it is a combination of voices and concerns – a symphony or perhaps a cacophony of sounds and struggles fighting for the clarity of those important American values – freedom, liberty, equality, democracy. And we will work to protect those values anywhere, anytime, anyplace as we have since 1776.

It is every citizen's civic right and responsibility to be engaged in the goings on of our country – to vote, to march, to lobby, to speak up and speak out. In this spirit I hope you will consider joining me and others from Temple Shalom *May 19-21, 2019 for the Union of Reform Judaism's Religious Action Center's conference called "Consultation on Conscience"*. It is a biennial social justice leadership conference held over three days in Washington, D.C. The Consultation empowers the Reform Jewish Movement through leadership development; opportunities for network and community building; and active dialogue culminating in an afternoon of advocacy on Capitol Hill about issues of concern to the Reform movement. It is open to anyone looking to build relationships and deepen their engagement with national leaders and policy makers in D.C.

## From the Desk of Rodney Schlosser Temple President 2018-2019

Dear Fellow Congregants:

In recent months, I've used this space to profile outstanding Board members, volunteers, and staff. We'll take a quick departure this month to provide updates on two important topics:

### **Building Improvements**

During Hanukkah, two generous families came forward with a \$250,000 challenge grant if we can raise \$250,000 by February 28...to fund three very necessary projects:

**Security:** We need to make enhancements to several aspects of our classrooms, meeting spaces, and worship areas in the event of a lockdown or emergency evacuation. After the tragic events at the synagogue in Pittsburgh last year, this has become more important as a complement to our existing security guards, cameras, and locks.

**Kitchen Overhaul**: It gets heavy use, but some appliances are broken, cabinets are in disrepair, and the layout is no longer optimal for current needs. The plan is to redesign and replace what can't be fixed. This is a big job which we'll schedule for this summer, so it doesn't impact b'nei mitzvahs, Shabbat dinners, or Sisterhood and Brotherhood events.

**Roof Repair**: The puddles are getting bigger and more frequent, and we can't jeopardize the building's structural integrity. We can't wait any longer.

We don't have time for a big campaign to raise the \$250,000 to "earn" the first \$250,000, so I encourage you to contact Rabbi Paley, Steve Lewis (executive director), or me (<a href="mailto:president@TempleShalomDallas.org">president@TempleShalomDallas.org</a>) if you'd like to discuss a gift. Pledges of \$10,000 can be paid over three years, and naming opportunities are available for gifts of \$50,000.

### **Leasing Classrooms to a Charter School**

More than 100 members attended the January 6th Town Hall concerning the proposal to lease classrooms to a charter school. The questions and suggestions were helpful, and the Board has also spent considerable time discussing the topic.

The process has yielded strong support for rental income to support our operating budget. Charter schools begin marketing in February/March for the following school year, and that was creating challenges for both our evaluation and the school's hiring and marketing. As a result, the school has revised its targets and will plan for a 2020-21 opening. That will give us more time to complete our evaluation of this school, and potentially others. This will also allow us to work with the City of Dallas on a zoning permit, which is necessary for a school of more than 150 students at our site. I encourage you to reach out to members of the Charter School/Lease Due Diligence Committee if you have questions or input: Bob Aisner, Chair; Richard Frapart, Stephanie Hirsh, Debra Levy-Fritts, and Jason Gadsby. These individuals collectively have extensive experience in public education financing, charter school management, the temple budget, and our tikkun olam initiatives.

Temple Shalom is ours. WE are the community. Thank you for your continued commitment and support for all that WE are doing.

### **BROTHERHOOD**



As I write this column, I am overcome with thoughts and feelings, and those that have yet to surface.

These come as a result of our recent Shalom Awards Dinner that just concluded on Sunday, January 13<sup>th</sup>, which honored Justice Douglas Lang, a veteran former justice on the 5<sup>th</sup> State District Court of Appeals. Justice Lang described receiving the award as the "greatest"

honor" of his life to date. He's led a life of countless achievements in his athletic, educational, legal, charitable, and judicial endeavors to date. His family, friends and colleagues were bowled over by the elaborateness, entertainment value and attention to detail that our Shalom Awards evening provides its attendees. In particular, first-timers! They're never prepared for what's about to happen as it never fails to surpass their already heightened expectations.

This year we'd had a particularly blue-ribbon crowd of some of our local area's most prestigious people from varied professions. These are largely folks who go to awards banquets on a regular basis, expect the usual banquet routine and, if I can be quite cliché, "We took them to school!" When you've thoroughly impressed those who've encountered it all on the banquet circuit, it leaves one a great feeling of achievement and execution!!

In its 12<sup>th</sup> year of existence, our Shalom Award Dinner has evolved into something even bigger than our Temple Shalom Brotherhood. This is not us saying it either. Having worked pretty actively on five of these now, I can say planning and implementing the evening's festivities are definitely a lot of work. 
