What are we waiting for? : Patience and the Urgency of Now



It is a well-known feature of our lives that the pace and energy of our activities is high and seems to get higher and faster every year. Perhaps it was always that way, perhaps it is more acute than ever before. Trying to be patient, slow down, taking deep breaths and otherwise trying to counter this force is difficult for sure. Hand-Made Midrash: A Workshop in Visual Theology

Dr. Jo Milgrom created the concept of hand-made Midrash and the title of this program in 1992, using a combination of text study, art, and writing to reflect on the meaning of Torah and God's place in our lives. In 1965, in his speech during the March on Washington, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. said, “We are now faced with the fact that tomorrow is today. We are confronted with the fierce urgency of now. In this unfolding conundrum of life and history, there ‘is’ such a thing as being too late. This is no time for apathy or complacency. This is a time for vigorous and positive action.” As he called for specific policies and legislation that led to the Voting Rights Act, Medicare and Medicaid, he reminded a divided nation that we need one another, and that we are stronger when we march forward, together. More than a half century later, Dr. King’s words have renewed meaning.

Picking up on this ideal, Temple Shalom, along with First Unitarian Church of Dallas, Trinity Fellowship Church and the Islamic Association of North Texas have been partnering in a program entitled “Friends For Good”. This program engages our communities with conversation and fellowship that has led to lasting friendships and important dialogue. Join us as we hear from members of Temple Shalom and Friends For Good about their experiences and why this effort, unique in Dallas, is so very important at this time in our lives.

High Holy Days Ticket Policy 2019 - 5780

- ☆ All 8:00pm and 10:00am services require a ticket for adults.
- ☆ 5:30pm services and Yom Kippur afternoon services and programs are open to members and the community and do not require a ticket.
- ☆ Children of members, up to age 18, may accompany their parents to services without a ticket.
- ☆ College students may use their Student ID Card in lieu of a ticket.
- ☆ Military personnel may use proper identification if not in uniform.
- ☆ Adult children (of members) under the age of 26, who are not students, may be issued a ticket upon request.
- ☆ Parents who wish to take their child out of the Sanctuary during the service may accompany their child to the Learning Center to continue following the service.

TICKETS ARE NOT TRANSFERABLE AND ARE FOR THE USE OF MEMBERS ONLY.

SANCTUARY SEATING FOR NON-MEMBERS

- ☆ **Sanctuary seating is available to our members' immediate family (parents, grandparents, and adult children and grandchildren) who live either locally or out of town. (Limitations may apply.) Cost is \$180 per person per Holy Day.**
- ☆ Those who reside further than 100 miles from Dallas, and who are members in good standing of another Jewish congregation, may have their congregation mail or fax 972-661-2636 a request for courtesy reciprocal tickets on their behalf.

High Holy Days Food Drive

- ☆ One of the High Holy Days traditions at Temple Shalom is our annual Food Drive. Just as last year, our beneficiaries will be the many clients of the North Texas Food Bank (NTFB), and those of the Jewish Family Service (JFS) Food Pantry. Both serve our community here in North Dallas.
- ☆ NTFB and JFS represent our commitment to serving the hungry and food insecure among us, both throughout North Texas and right here in our neighborhood. We have two ways for our congregants to participate.
- ☆ Please go to the Temple Shalom website at www.templeshalomdallas.org and follow the link from the home page to donate to our virtual food drive. Please note that NTFB will immediately email a tax-deductible acknowledgement. Our virtual drive begins September 1, 2019 and ends October 31, 1919.
- ☆ We ask that you consider a financial donation equal to the amount of money you would spend on food to feed your family for a typical day. Our goal is to raise \$3,000 in this year's High Holy Days Food Drive to provide 12,000 meals to hungry families in our area.
- ☆ Please contribute canned food for the JFS Food Pantry. After Rosh Hashanah services, you will receive a list of "high-need" items for the drive.
- ☆ In keeping with Temple Shalom's recycling initiative, we ask that you use your own bag(s)/box(es) to bring in your canned donations for JFS. To participate, you MUST return your donation at Yom Kippur services. Food items cannot be accepted at Temple Shalom after October 9, 2019.

SECURITY & PARKING PERSONNEL

Parking attendants, uniformed police and security officers will be located throughout the complex. Your cooperation with their requests is greatly appreciated.

PARKING

To enter the Temple Shalom parking area, a “TSD” decal must be visible on your car windshield. Parking is on a first-come, first-served basis. **Limited parking will be available at Debre Berhan church (NW corner of Alpha/Hillcrest).**

BUILDING ENTRANCES

Entry into the Temple will be at the Main Entrance on the north side of the building, and at the entrance on the south side. Other entrances, including the Lifelong Learning entrance on the east side, will be closed.

USHERS

Ushers will be located both inside and outside the Temple, providing assistance and helping provide the best experience for all congregants. Thank you for following their directions.

Please note that children who are attending services in the Sanctuary must sit with their families. Those third grade and younger must be escorted by an adult to the restrooms.

FIREARMS POLICY

Guns and firearms are prohibited on Temple Shalom property, other than those guns or firearms held by those hired for the security and safety of Temple Shalom as well as active duty military personnel, sworn peace officers or court officers in the discharge of official duties.
