A Note from Cantor Avery





The prayer *V'ahavta* commands us to love God. We are told to love Adonai, our God, with all our heart, with all our soul, and with all our might. We show our love for God through following God's commandments and laws. These words immediately follow the words of the *Sh'ma*, our most central declaration of faith as Jews. The *Sh'ma* immediately follows the prayer in our evening liturgy, *Ahavat Olam*, and in the morning, *Ahava Rabba*. We find the Hebrew word 'love,' *Ahava*, in both of these prayers and in

the text we read as prayer, *V'ahavta*. Both *Ahavat Olam* and *Ahava Rabba* are prayers that speak of God's love for the people of Israel. God shows us love through giving us the Torah, giving us laws and precepts, and by showing us compassion.

Here we have it: God's love for us - *Ahavat Olam & Ahava Rabba*, Our declaration of faith — *Sh'ma*, and Our love for God — *V'ahavta*. The *Sh'ma* is bookended with love.

On November 10th, at 5pm, in my concert "For the Love of God," we will be exploring concepts like these through music. We will explore our relationship with God through text, through personal experiences, through the holidays, through difficult times, and through humorous moments. The love story between God and the Jewish people has the equivalent breadth and depth as our relationships with each other, spanning every human emotion, experience, and thought.

V'ahavta for Elul

In the month of *Elul* it has become our custom to use the new *Mishkan Halev*, the siddur for we use for *S'lichot*, and will also use for Shabbat *Shuva* this coming Shabbat, October 4th. In it, we have this beautiful poetic version of the *V'ahavta*:

V'ahavta for Elul

You shall love the ones who are close With all your heart, With all your spirit, With all your strength.

Remember these words, inscribe them on your heart: Love them when they struggle, when they sadden and disappoint you; Love them when they fail.

See the good within them, even when they can't. Look at them, and listen, even when it's hard. Be grateful for their guidance (even their reproof) When they save you from yourself.

Love them when they give you joy, And love them when they don't. When you lie down, let go of anger. When you rise up at dawn, begin again.

Praise them for their deeds at home; Speak to them in public with respect.

Bind yourself to the ones you love
With promises kept and vows fulfilled.
Open to them the gates of your heart, the doorway of your soul –
and let them know you.
So shall the ones you cherish feel your love, your presence, and your care.

Nowhere in our original text of *V'ahavta* does it tell us to love people. It tells us to love God and follow God's commandments. It speaks of our relationship to God and God's laws, not our connection with the people in our lives. What I love deeply and dearly about this poetic version is that it suggests loving people, especially the ones in our lives, is how we love God and how we engage in God's laws. God, Creator of all life, Giver of the Divine spark to each human soul, resides through that spark in each human. Loving people, loving ourselves, is indeed how we love God. I do believe, like our sages taught, that this is the greatest wisdom of our Torah.

As we count the days until Yom Kippur during this time of *Shuva*, this time of return, let us return to love. Let us face this New Year of 5780 with love in our hearts, not only for others, but for ourselves. Let us show our love for God through acts of kindness, compassion, grace, mercy, and gentleness. Shana tova to you all.

Shanah Tovah! As you may have heard, the New Year brings several important enhancements to our building...a remodeled kitchen, a repaired roof, cement work in some of our outdoor spaces, and new security communication equipment in the classrooms.

Many thanks to the 35+ families who collectively pledged over \$500,000 to support the 2019 Capital Campaign. The full roster is listed on page 8.

The most visible changes are in the kitchen – which now has a separate beverage bar for everyday needs. The large cooking and storage spaces will require key access and feature an updated layout with new appliances, prep areas, cabinetry, and finishes. The Sisterhood increased their pledge this summer to underwrite elegant new dishes and flatware (service for 300)! Many people have commented that our facilities truly are now the ideal venue for a variety of simchas and private affairs – luncheons, dinner parties, receptions, and other social events.

None of this could have happened without the thorough, patient, and steadfast work of several key committees: Kitchen Planning Input, Kitchen Governance, and Building & Grounds. These volunteers have earned a round of applause! See full list on page 8.

With the opening of the kitchen, we're launching a Food & Wine Series. It kicked off with a challah baking program on September 22 (led by our own Julie Gadsby), and continues with six more brunch, dinner, and baking/cooking events November 2019 – March 2020. See page 12 for details.

"Temple Shalom has been home to our family for over 25 years. Throughout this time, the clergy and community have supported us in celebration, in sadness and through challenging times.


