I Was Just Thinking...



1977. It was an interesting year. Inflation was 6.5%. The average cost of a new home was \$43,000.00. Average yearly income was \$15,000.00. A gallon of gas was 65 cents. The first Apple computer went on sale. Jimmy Carter was elected President. Elvis Presley died. The New York City Blackout lasted for 25 hours. The U.S. returns the Panama Canal to Panama. And the SNAP Program finally becomes law.

SNAP is the acronym for the Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program, the food assistance program that came into being as an outgrowth of the FSP, the Food Stamp Program, whose trials and experiments date back to 1959. But, it wasn't until 1977 that congress formally enacted the Food and Agriculture Act and the SNAP program and its support finally became law, due in large part through the unlikely alliance between George McGovern and Bob Dole. That was 40 years ago, last month.

Recently, Norm Orenstein of *The Atlantic* wrote that, "According to Feeding America, 42 million Americans suffer from what the experts call food insecurity—for many, it is simply hunger, period; for others, it is like Debra, rarely if ever getting a full and nutritious meal, often finding near the end of the month that there is nothing left to buy food until the next allotment of food stamps, and perhaps getting by with food banks. According to the Department of Agriculture, 80 percent of SNAP benefits are used within the first half of the month. The consequences of food insecurity are bad; trouble concentrating, more vulnerable to illness. A new study by University of South Carolina researchers found that kids who took tests near the beginning of the month when they had more food stamps did significantly better than those who took the same tests near the end of the month, when they were less able to have regular meals. Another longitudinal study found that poor children with access to SNAP benefits, years later had lower rates of heart disease and obesity, along with better high school performance, than kids who did not. Leaving people hungry hurts not just them, but the entire society, adding to health costs and reducing productivity. SNAP has dramatically reduced the problems of dire hunger, at least providing a kind of lifeline for millions of Americans—and not just those who do not work. In fact, 81 percent of SNAP benefits go to those who are working or to those we do not expect to work—children,

the elderly, the disabled. In other words, SNAP benefits the most vulnerable among us, especially those in dire poverty. It is one of the most successful programs we have had in our social safety net." And is being considered for serious cuts and reductions.

Just a little math. In 2016, there were 44 million people benefitting from this program. And, in Texas, 15% of Texans, 3.7 million people, receive food stamps including 1.5 million children. For a family of four, the maximum monthly allotment could be \$649.00. Assuming each person eats 3 meals a day, every day, that means there are 360 meals needed. At \$649.00 that means each person is allotted \$1.80 per meal, per day. That's if the family of four is eligible for the maximum amount. That was a hard fact to swallow as I enjoyed my Starbucks latte.

As we start this new year and work towards thinking about what the world needs now, I have always maintained that until and unless we make sure that no one ever wants for food, we will never be the kind of country and society which we dream about. Our country especially, should lead the way in making sure everyone is fed. We don't have a production problem, we have 'a will to make it happen' problem. As Hubert Humphry once said, "*The moral test of government is how that government treats those who are in the dawn of life, the children; those who are in the twilight of life, the elderly; and those who are in the shadows of life, the sick, the needy and the handicapped.*"

May this be the year when, once and for all, we are hungry no more.



Dina Pruzhansky is a Russian born, Israeli-raised composer and pianist, based in New York City. Her compositions have been featured at a number of internationally recognized festivals across the United States and Europe, and at major New York City venues such as Jazz at Lincoln Center, Weill Carnegie Hall, Merkin Hall, Bargemusic, Le Poisson Rouge, Symphony Space and more. Numerous TV and radio broadcasts include an exclusive WQXR program hosted by Robert Sherman.

Ms. Pruzhansky writes in a variety of genres, ranging from classical to liturgical to musical theatre. She is a member of the Tony-honored BMI Advanced Musical Theatre Workshop and was named a finalist for the Fred Ebb Award for Excellence in Musical Theatre writing, with the award-winning lyricist Matt Schatz. Her opera *Shulamit*, written and premiered in 2014, has enjoyed its full production at the JCC of Manhattan in 2016. She composed music for a full Friday night liturgy service, commissioned by Temple Israel of Northern Westchester.

As a pianist, Ms. Pruzhansky has appeared in solo and chamber music recitals throughout the United States, Russia, Israel, Canada, Italy, Belgium and Germany, and has shared the stage with many distinctive artists, including soloists of the Metropolitan and San Francisco Operas, and members of the Israel Philharmonic and the Met Orchestra.

Dina is a post-graduate alumna from Mannes School of Music. In addition, she holds MA, summa cum laude, in Piano Performance from the Tel-Aviv University, and a Bachelor degree in Art History. A passionate educator, she is the author of "I Can Play Chopin" easy piano arrangements series, and is currently serving as a faculty member at the 92Y School of Music.

On Saturday, October 21st (following Munchkins Minyan) we will have our annual **Bless the Pets** ceremony! We invite you to bring your pets for a special blessing and a delicious reception (for humans and pets). This year we will also have *Cody's Friend's Rescue* with us for pet adoptions and donations. In honor of this special event, I have included a short text study on the treatment of animals in Judaism. I'm looking forward to seeing you later this month!

Biblical Texts

[A] "...the seventh day is a Sabbath unto the Lord your God: you shall not do any work, you, your son or daughter, your male or female servant, or your *cattle*..." [Exodus 20:10]

[B] "You shall not plow with an ox and mule harnessed together" [since both animals, being of unequal size and strength, will suffer]. [Deuteronomy 22:10]

[C] "If, along the road, you chance upon a bird's nest, in any tree or on the ground, with fledglings or eggs and the mother sitting over the fledglings or on the eggs, do not take the mother together with her young. Let the mother [fly away], and [only then] take the young, in order that you may fare well and have a long life." [Deuteronomy 22:6-7]

[D] "...no animal from the herd or from the flock shall be slaughtered on the same day with its young." [Leviticus 22:28]

From Maimonides Guide to the Perplexed 3:48

"It is prohibited to kill an animal and its young...in such a manner that the young is slain in the sight of its mother, for the pain of the animals under such circumstances is very great. There is no difference in this case between the pain of man and the pain of other living beings, since the love and tenderness of the mother for her young ones...exists not only in man but in most living beings.

The same reason applies to the law that obligates us to let the mother fly away when we take the young...If the law provides that such grief not be caused to cattle or birds, how much more careful must we be not to cause grief to our fellow man."

Rabbinic Texts

[A] "A person is prohibited to eat until he first feeds his animals." [Babylonian Talmud, Berakhot 40a]

[B] "Once, while Moses was tending to the flock of his father-in-law Jethro, one young sheep ran away. Moses ran after it until the sheep reached a shady place where he found a pool of water and began to drink. When Moses reached the sheep, he said: 'I did not know you ran away because you were thirsty. Now, you must be exhausted'.

Moses put the sheep on his shoulders and carried him [back to the herd]. God said, 'Because you tend the sheep belonging to human beings with such mercy, by your life I swear you shall be the shepherd of My sheep, Israel.'" [Exodus Rabbah 2:2]



Did you know:

- **Every \$1 = 3 meals.** 94 cents of every dollar donated goes directly to programs fighting hunger, with only 6 cents going towards administrative/fundraising expenses.
- More than **853,000 people in NTFB's 13-county service area are food insecure** - that's **1 in every 6 people**.
- **One in every four children** in North Texas is food insecure (more than 300,000 children).
- **Only 9% of the individuals we serve are homeless.** Hunger affects not only the unemployed, but those who are under-employed. These individuals are food-insecure: **95% of households served by the NTFB have an annual household income of \$30,000 or less.**
- **The North Texas Food Bank provides access to nearly 190,000 nutritious meals a day.** Although that number is great, there is a need for nearly 300,000 nutritious meals a day to feed hungry people in North Texas.





DAI has been active in a number of areas, and has a strategic plan for ongoing activities for the next year. The areas that DAI is concentrating on offer opportunities for Temple members to become involved in a meaningful way and correlate well with other Temple Shalom Tikkun Olam activities. Each area has a working team from multiple congregations. The areas are:

Housing – DAI wants to build on the passage of the revised Chapter 27 of the Housing Code to further both improved living conditions and affordable housing in the communities with which we work. These efforts include DAI's asthma initiative called Dallas Interfaith Asthma. We are planning one of the asthma screening events as part of the Food Truck Palooza in April. Other locations for screening events will be added in other communities. Plans are underway to bring the renowned author Robert Rothstein to Dallas for a community seminar.

Citizenship – DAI has determined that there are over 130,000 legal immigrants who are eligible to become citizens and to register to vote. A number of Methodist congregations, the Archdiocese of Dallas, immigration lawyers and other congregations in DAI are active in the process. The goal is to get 10,000 to become citizens and register. Literacy is key to this effort, as is legal support.

Other Immigration Related activities – these include a workgroup on a Dallas ID card, Senate Bill 4 and other immigration activities. Working with a broad coalition an event is being planned. Archbishop Burns has agreed to lead this effort.

Police Community Relations – DAI has developed a close working relationship with the Dallas City Police Department and other police forces including Farmer's Branch, Arlington and others. Some of these efforts are aimed at improved community policing and furthering relationships with the departments. Others include building trust relationships between immigrants and the departments, educating community residents on interacting with the police and continuing DAI's work at cleaning up drug-infested street corners.

Education – Some DAI congregations are working on early education and on with selected secondary schools. DAI played a key role in getting approval of the zoning change needed for the Lumen Preschool in the Los Altos neighborhood of West Dallas.

Worker safety and worker rights – DAI continues to work with the Workers Defense Project around the Better Builder Program and Wage Theft. DAI's meeting with WDP with the Dallas County District Attorney led to the first conviction on the perpetrator for felony wage theft and the worker received a check for his back wages.

Accountability Meetings with Elected Officials – a number of these are being planned to focus those running for office on issues of interest to the community.
