I Was Just Thinking...



Jewish time is a funny thing. We know that Jewish days begin in the evening and extend for 25 hours. Apart from trying to determine when evening begins, the Jewish calendar has other weird elements to it. Since it is derived from both religious and harvest specific times, the calculations for the exact number of days is complicated. In short, the lunar year, which determines religious dates (like Yom Kippur and other holidays) is 11 days shorter than the solar year (which determines the harvest schedules). As a result, the calendar needs to be tweaked 7 times during a 19-year period. Even with this intercalation, the average Hebrew calendar year is longer by about 6 minutes and 40 seconds than the current solar year, so that every 216 years

the Hebrew calendar will fall a day behind the current solar year. So when we say, as we often do, that the “holidays are late this year,” it feels true since, mathematically speaking it actually is. Nevertheless, we always seem to celebrate all the holidays in their proper order every year, whether or not they are “on time.”

We seem to be able to do this quite well with every major and most minor holidays. The one that seems to get lost in the holiday shuffle is the Festival of Shavuot. It seems to fall off our calendar senses since we attenuate much of our holiday, vacation, business and even our temple workings around an “academic year” typically August-May. Most of the Jewish holidays do indeed fall within this time frame, so it makes sense that’s where our attention lies. This Jewish calendar year, however is slightly different.

This year, beginning in the evening of June 4th, we will celebrate the Festival of Shavuot. This is a major holiday, one of three that have the designation “Festival.” The others are Sukkot and Passover. The word Shavuot means “weeks” and marks the conclusion of the “counting of the Omer.” The Omer is a sacrifice of a specific amount of barley (called an omer) which was offered on the beginning of the spring harvest. The Torah commands that we count 49 days (the number of days of the spring harvest) and then on the 50th day, another offering was made announcing the summer harvest. These Weeks or Shavuot were important agricultural and religious moments in the life of the ancient community. Later rabbinic tradition will link the commandment to count the omer for seven weeks and the Torah’s description of the seven weeks it took the Israelites to get to Mt. Sinai. Thus, Passover and the beginning of the Omer we were freed from Slavery and on 50 days later, at Mt. Sinai, on Shavuot we were given the Torah and became a nation committed to serving God. This idea of Shavuot being the time when we received Torah, when we learn Torah and when we celebrate Jewish learning in general has been with the Jewish people since the 12th century.

This year at Temple Shalom, we wish to celebrate this tradition and this important holiday by honoring our teachers and celebrating our learners. In a long overdue moment, we will gather as a community in true thanksgiving for all we have learned from so many for so long. I hope you will join us for a wonderful evening of study and celebration brought to us by our Adult Education committee and our experiment in adult learning, called JeWEL – Jewish Engagement and Learning. Please join us at 7:00pm on Saturday, June 4th.

Standing together as a community, hearing words of Torah, having God’s words revealed to us and making a commitment to lifelong learning must have been an awesome moment for the ancient Israelites. The fact that we are still honoring Torah and honoring Torah teachers is testament to the power of that moment at Mt. Sinai. We have been given an amazing gift and I look forward to celebrating that gift with you and all those who have taught and who have learned.

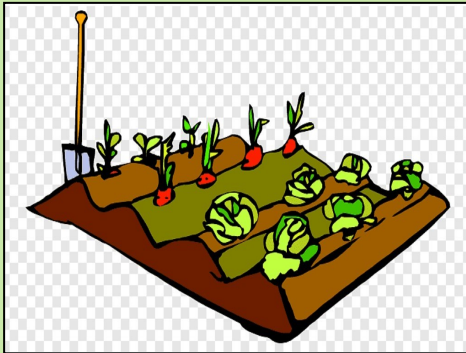

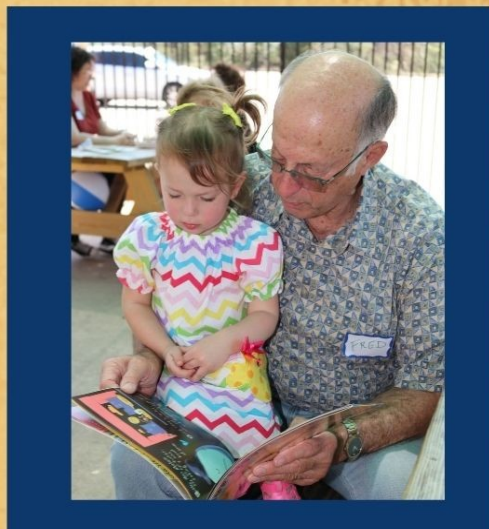

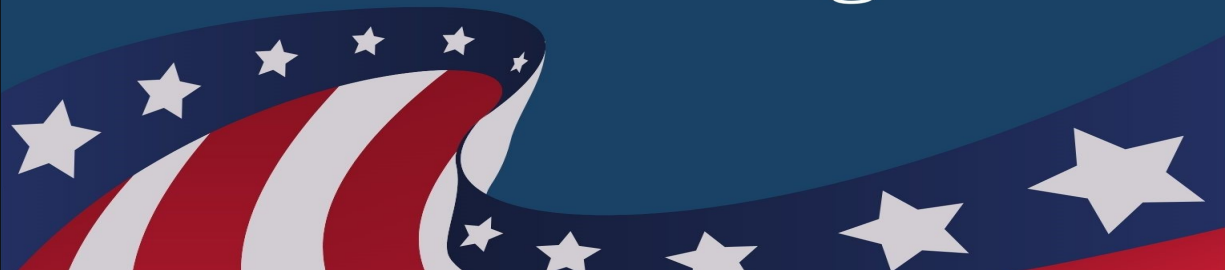

Last year at this time, I spoke about the **Gifting Framework for Jewish Learning and Engagement** that had shaped my thinking about our program. You can find out more here: <https://jec-ifnotnowwhen.weebly.com/gifting-framework.html>. I'm thrilled to say that after a year of focusing on the gifts of:

1. the **uniqueness, value and blessing of each individual**
2. avenues for finding **joy, comfort and gratitude**, as well as supports for **making sense of an often times chaotic world**
a tradition of questions and questioning

We have made great progress in achieving our core values of:

1. **Wonder** Peleh/ פֶּלֶח
2. **Joy** Simcha/ שמחה
3. **Friendship** Yedidut/ יְדִידוּת
4. **Holy community** Kehillah Kedosha/ קהילה קדושה

This past year I was blessed to watch friendships form across all grades in our program. We have truly created a holy community that respects and celebrates all its members.

I was pleased to see our learners empowered to begin asking big questions about life and Judaism and to engage with our tradition of questioning. We will be building on this skill again next year as we expand our inquiry-based approach to learning.

When I talk about an inquiry approach I'm talking about encouraging our learners to engage in research, to engage deeply with tradition and text, to explore multiple interpretations and most importantly, to develop their own, personally meaningful answers to life's big questions. On the last day of school we asked learners to think about big questions upon which to build next year's learning. Here is some of what they suggested that our 3rd-6th graders will be exploring:

- Why do we pray?
- How can Hebrew help us better understand Judaism?
- Where did Jews come from and what does it mean to be Jewish today?

Be sure to encourage your children to keep asking big questions and feel free to share those questions with me! The greatest gift our children can gain from deeply exploring and engaging with Jewish tradition is to create a meaningful, personal path to follow through this broken and complex world. The holy community of Temple Shalom is here to journey alongside you and your children and provide you with community, tools and gifts along the way. Why not invite your friends to join us on this journey?

Crucial Conversations: Challenging AAPI Hatred

A four-part series on challenging hatred against Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders (AAPI). We aim to foster an increased understanding of the origins and history of discrimination against the AAPI community, to discuss the recent increase in anti-AAPI violence and rhetoric, and to identify concrete steps that can be taken to confront and disrupt AAPI hatred. For these sessions, we will convene a diverse group of experts to share their knowledge, experiences, and ideas.

Session 2: The Past, Part 2

Thursday, June 2 - 7:00pm

In the second session of this series, we will continue our discussion of the history of Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders in the United States, including the immigrant and refugee experiences, anti-AAPI laws, and challenges faced and overcome by AAPI communities.

Session 3: The Present

Thursday, July 7 - 7:00pm

In the third session, we will discuss current-day discrimination with a focus on hate crimes, stereotypes, and perceptions of Asian Americans. The U.S. saw a drastic increase in anti-Asian rhetoric and attacks following the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. Who is participating in the rise of discrimination, and how does this impact AAPI communities?

Session 4: The Future

Thursday, August 4 - 7:00pm

In the final session, we will discuss concrete strategies to combat AAPI hatred. Building on the foundation of history, knowledge, and understanding developed during the series, this session will serve as a call to action for all of us to engage in this work.
