## *I Was Just Thinking...*



I was never a fan of dressing up and acting out plays and the like. Speaking in front of people – no problem. Singing in front of people – no problem. Dressing up and acting things out – big problem. Not sure why, but it never felt comfortable. So when it comes to the holiday of Purim where dressing up, putting on masks and wildly celebrating in costume, it's always been a struggle.

Purim, as we know, commemorates the story told in the book of Esther, when Haman, a senior official of the Persian Empire, persuaded the king to issue a decree to annihilate all Jews, young and old, men, women and children, on one day: a warrant for genocide. Thanks to the vigilance of Mordechai and the courage of Esther, the decree was not carried out, and ever since, we've celebrated by reading the story, having parties, giving to the poor and sharing gifts of food with friends, dressing in costume and celebrating with such a degree that, as the Talmud tell us, "...we should celebrate until we don't know the difference between the names of Haman and Mordechai". Go figure!

I used to be very puzzled by this. Why such exhilaration at merely surviving a tragedy that was only narrowly averted? Relief, I can understand. But to turn the day into a carnival? Just because we're still here to tell the story? Seems weird, no?

As Rabbi Jonathan Sacks explains it, Jews have a long memory. We remember how much pain there has been in Jewish history, how many massacres and pogroms throughout the ages. Jews had to learn how to live with the past without being traumatized by it. So what did we do? "We turned the day when we faced and then escaped the greatest danger of all into a festival of unconfined joy, a day of dressing up and drinking a bit too much, to exorcise the fear, live through it and beyond it, and then come back to life, unhaunted by the ghosts of memory."

Purim is the Jewish answer to one of the great questions of history: "How do you live with the past without being held captive by the past?" Ours is a religion of memory, because if you forget the past, you'll find yourself repeating it. Yet it's also a future-oriented faith. To be a Jew is to answer the question, 'Has the Messiah come?', with the words, 'Not yet.'

There are so many parts of the world today where ancient grievances are still being played out, as if history were a hamster wheel in which however fast we run we find ourselves back where we started. Purim is a way of saying, remember the past, but then look at the children, celebrate with them, and for their sake, put the past behind you and build a better future.

Maybe dressing up is a way of saying the current wardrobe of our state of thinking, acting and behaving is sufficient. We can imagine a time that is different, better, more colorful, and in a way more reflective of who we are and what we want our world to look like and feel like. That takes imagination. That takes courage. That takes some effort to get out of our comfort zone. While it may be fun to dress up in costume once a year (or more) but what we are really trying to do is to assert the power of hopeful and joyful thinking and living in a world that needs more of it. Thankfully Purim gives us a chance to live that out, to be happy, to be playful and to reminded of what our world should be about.

I'm not sure you'll see me in costume, but I'll try. For sure I'll be celebrating a brief moment of redemption that I hope will last more than one evening.

Chag Purim Samech! I look forward to celebrating with you!

## ***Presidential Nu's***



Brick and mortar. My American generation was raised on the idea that when you moved to a new town you first decided which synagogue you would join (my parents also scouted Chinese restaurants). But the question was never *Should we join a synagogue?*, but rather *Which synagogue should we join?*

Back in the day there were many reasons to affiliate immediately. There was the desire to have a place to pray as part of a community. There was the need for cemetery plots (if you wanted to be buried in a community's Jewish cemetery, you likely needed to be a member of a synagogue; you could not turn to eBay to bid on a Jewish cemetery plot). And other lifecycle moments; a place to gather together in a Jewish setting? We also joined synagogues to make friends, send our children to Hebrew School, and even to meet future spouses. Joining Brotherhood or Sisterhood meant being a member of an auxiliary that were pillars of the temple: running a gift shop, building the Sukkah, running the Purim Carnival, ushering, working in the kitchen, etc. Being a member of a youth group brought self-pride in your synagogue as you represented your congregation at regional events and camp.

Today many Jews do not immediately join a synagogue. They wait until they "need" to join. Some figure it will be there if I need it. Meanwhile, why pay for something I may not use for years? Some say, *Why can't I just pay for the services I need? Why should I pay for the brick and mortar?*

Those are all reasonable and sensible viewpoints and questions, so let me answer them. First and foremost: Because one should not assume it will be there when you need it. Without members, synagogues close. I get why no one, including me, gets excited when they receive their dues (or "membership commitment," as we euphemistically call it). But when I go to high holiday services, I like to be able to sit in comfortable seats, have books (or large screens), have a speaker system, have air conditioning on (yes, it is always on too high for some and too low for others), and have clergy leading the service. I like the fact that we have bathrooms, toilet paper, a fully functional kitchen, and we can open our beautiful ark and take from it a Torah. And to have all that we have to pay our electric, gas, and water bills, along with the insurance, the people who cut the grass, the security people, etc. It all costs money, and those are just a few of the hundreds of things our dues pay for, that we may otherwise take for granted.

I travel for work, love to vacation, and basically use three rooms in my house (the kitchen, the family room, and my bedroom (which comes with a bathroom)). But I still pay for the whole house. Being part of a community means supporting the community. Every congregant who has had an illness or a death in the family knows and appreciates why we are members of Temple Shalom; because the congregation rallies around those who are in need or hurting. Because we never know when we will need our community, but what we give to our community is nothing compared to what we get when we are the ones down.

Today we are not competing with other congregations for membership; our biggest competitor is apathy. I am proud to be a member of Temple Shalom and our community. I am proud to be active in our community. Everyone contributes to our congregation differently, and that is great. Of course, money maintains the brick and mortar for the house, but volunteering is what makes our congregation a home. Volunteerism is our congregation's greatest strength. Not everyone can contribute a thousand dollars to the annual fund. But handing out books during high holiday services, working in Traditions, helping in the garden, helping repaint the temple, working at the golf tournament, these are all vital contributions. Our members are what makes us *who* we are as a community.

So where am I going with all this? I was always taught that the mark of being a good Jewish parent is not that my children remain Jewish but that their children (my grandchildren) are raised Jewish. We need to be teaching our children the vital importance of being members of a Jewish community. That Zoom and JDate are ways to meet Jews, but not avenues to be part of being members of a Jewish *community*. If we want our community to be here for our grandchildren, then we need our children to also be part of our community. I know I am preaching to the choir, but we need this message to reach out to the community, because congregations may not be here for our grandchildren if the message is not heard. Together we need to instill in the younger generation a recognition and to embrace the value of communal Jewish education, lifecycle events, worship, and socializing. That way, it will be there for all our grandchildren.

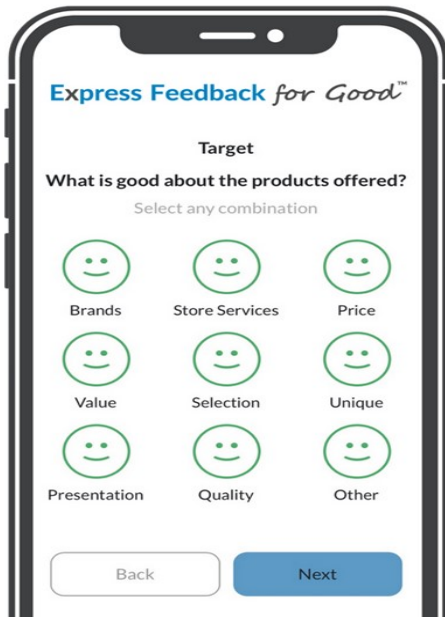

## Lifelong Learning/Worship Council



We are in the midst of a rapid-fire succession of holiday celebrations in the Jewish calendar. In February we celebrated TuBishvat. In March we will celebrate Purim and in April, Passover. Each holiday one month after the one before it, at the time of the full moon. This series of celebrations keeps us mindful of the cycle of the year, the seasons of our holidays and the seasons of our souls. During the TuBishvat seder we explicitly mark the seasons of the year connecting to the deeper meaning of each season to help us pay attention to our own potential for growth and change each year. In many ways, TuBishvat represents the end of the winter and the earliest beginnings of new growth. At Purim we celebrate with great joy and abandon, remembering the power of one person to make change in the world and the importance of revealing the hidden. As the TuBishvat seder teaches, people are so much more than they appear, and despite our size, shape, or color we all carry a divine spark in us – each of us created *B'tzelem Elohim*/in the image of God. In April we celebrate the season of our freedom and welcome in spring and new birth and growth. We are to experience the Seder and the holiday each year AS IF, as if we ourselves went out from Egypt, as if each of us was set free from what holds us back.

Masih Alinejad is an Iranian-American journalist and women's rights activist who gained worldwide attention when she removed her hijab and posted a photo on her Facebook page standing proudly with her hair blowing in the wind. My Stealthy Freedom, her 2014 viral social media campaign, sparked a civil disobedience movement against compulsory hijab in Iran. Today, My Stealthy Freedom is a nonprofit organization dedicated to supporting Iranian women and their freedom. Iranian authorities have responded violently to ongoing activism, harassing and beating protesters, firing into crowds, making arrests, and violating the rights of those in custody. Currently living in exile in New York, Alinejad continues to oppose Iran's regime, speak in defense of fellow activists, and offer valuable insights into the protests throughout her country. In recognition of her commitment to human rights, she has received the UN Watch's International Women's Rights Award and the American Jewish Committee's Moral Courage Award, among other honors.
