I Was Just Thinking...



In 1978 Douglas Adams created a British radio comedy broadcast that later spawned stage shows, a novel, comic books, a 1981 t.v. show, a 1984 video game and a 2005 feature film. By the time the feature film came out the novels had been translated into more than 30 languages and became an international multi-media phenomenon. "The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy." If you haven't seen it, put it in your Netflix queue...It's worth it. As we ready ourselves for the summer, I couldn't help but to think about the journeys we take and where they take us.

As a people, we are a people who journey. The founding of our national story began when one couple heard God's voice and decided to relocate from the land that they knew to a land that they didn't, believing God's presence and instructions will lead to blessing and prosperity. Abraham and Sarah started us out, we wandered into Egypt, we wandered in the desert, and to a certain extent we continue to wander, searching, exploring, journeying.

The Baal Shem Tov, the founder of Hasidic Judaism taught that the journeys of the Israelites are to be found in every person from the day of his birth until he returns to his world. Each individual's birth should be understood within the context of the Exodus from Egypt and the subsequent stages of life are journeys that lead from place to place until one comes to the land of the 'supernal world of life'.

Perhaps that is what Rabbi Alvin Fine was thinking when he wrote the now famous passage:

Birth is a beginning and death a destination;

But life is a journey.

A going, a growing from stage to stage:

From childhood to maturity and youth to old age.

From innocence to awareness and ignorance to knowing;

From foolishness to discretion and then perhaps, to wisdom.

From weakness to strength or strength to weakness and often back again.

From health to sickness and back we pray, to health again.

From offense to forgiveness, from loneliness to love,

From joy to gratitude, from pain to compassion.

From grief to understanding, from fear to faith;

From defeat to defeat to defeat, until, looking backward or ahead, we see that victory lies not at some high place along the way, but in having made the journey, stage by stage, a sacred pilgrimage.

Birth is a beginning and death a destination;

But life is a journey, a sacred pilgrimage,

Made stage by stage... To life everlasting.

So it got me thinking...If we were writing our hitchhiker's guide to our lives, the Trip Advisor review of the important places not to be missed, the Rotten Tomatoes index of where one should journey, what would we include? Would we include births and deaths? Weddings and bar/bat mitzvah? Would we include places where we saw cool things and met cool people? Would we include people who hurt us? People who changed us? Would we include moments we failed? Moments we succeeded? Would we include prayers of our hearts? Pleadings of our souls?

I don't know if the record of our journey is fit for the big screen, or if we would want to share it with anyone. What I do know is that all of us can decide what the stages can **mean** for us. *Will this part be a part of our record? Will we include what we did? How we felt? How we reacted? How we grew? How we changed? How we stayed the same? In every one of these moments, our tradition teaches us that there is a possibility for holiness and wholeness and that every stage matters. As Rabbi Chaim Stern wrote, "Days pass and the years vanish, and we walk sightless among miracles. God, fill our eyes with seeing and our minds with knowing; let there be moments when Your Presence, like lightning, illumines the darkness in which we walk. Help us to see, wherever we gaze, that the bush burns unconsumed. And we, clay touched by God, will reach out for holiness, and exclaim in wonder: How filled with awe is this place, and we did not know!"*

As the summer progresses, ask yourselves, "What's important about this time? Where is the holiness? Where is the beauty and where might we go next? I look forward to sharing the journey with you... stage by stage.

Although it's summer there is still SO much happening! Our Religious School faculty and I are busy planning for the next school year. We are focused on our core values: **Joy, Wonder, Friendship** and **Holy Community**. We are thinking about how to continue to **empower our learners to ask BIG QUESTIONS** and **create their own personally meaningful answers** to help them navigate this complicated world.

In 5784 we will be exploring the questions:

- ☆ What is the story of our Jewish family?

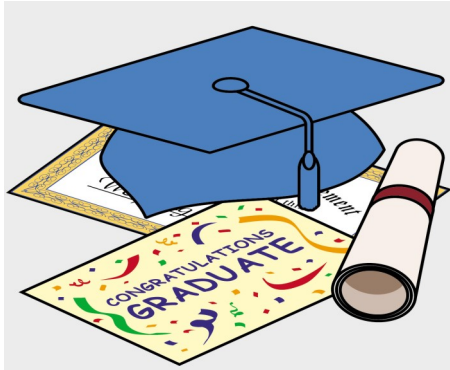

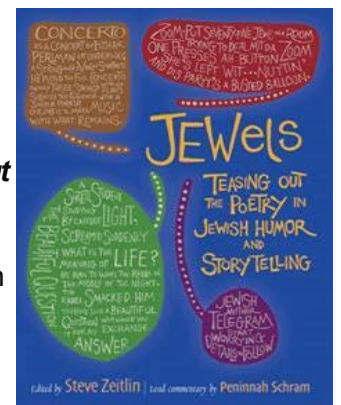

Once a report is made, security agents determine the urgency and, if necessary, work with the FBI or other law enforcement partners.

The information from the reports can also be used to keep better data on incidents, learn who is behind the threats, and track cases across communities. People can use their computers, tablets or cell phone to fill out the reports.
