Dear Religious School Families:

I read a post from a friend in Israel yesterday. She shared that on her grocery store receipt they had printed:

"Together we will Prevail." B'yachad N'natzeach.

These words exemplify the holy community we strive to create at Temple Shalom. We stand TOGETHER we will PREVAIL.

Because these are challenging times, we continue to lean into our core values of joy, wonder, friendship and holy community. We come together in difficulty and in joy to lift each other up and when necessary, to hold each other up. Your children seem to understand this instinctively and they model these values so clearly each time they are here.



This week we shared joy through our learning around this week's Torah portion, the story of Noah. We blessed animals, ate rainbows and sang together. Our Pre-K-3rd graders continue to enjoy the new Hebrew Through Movement sessions each week and are catching on to all new words and actions. Our 3rd-6th graders began discussing Abraham and trying to understand God's call to him and the covenant they created that is lived through us today. Here is some of what they had to say:

I learned that Abraham was originally called Abram and after he entered the covenant with God his name changed to Abraham, father of many nations.

I learned that we are all basically related to each other through God's covenant with Abraham.

I learned that Abram believed in God and followed God's instructions to an unknown place and then made a covenant with God.

In 7th grade, they discussed searching for facts and bias within resources, standing up for others around you, and setting a good example for the Jewish community through your actions. They took both a timely and historic perspective on these responsibilities. In preparation for the upcoming trip to the Holocaust and Human Rights Museum, they began discussing the Righteous Among the Nations as an example of helping others and standing up for what we know is right.

I hope the words of your children and their smiling faces each week bring you the same joy and comfort they bring to me. I know that navigating these challenging times can be overwhelming. We are here to help if you are struggling or are struggling with how to speak with your children about what is happening in Israel.
