# Security – Joel Guskin

- We have been awarded a \$150k Reimbursement Grant to harden the security of our building.
- A Security Fence Task Force has been established to figure out how best to accomplish this. Members include Stephanie Hirsh, Joel Guskin, Marshall Funk, Barry Epstein, Bob Landers and David Lamden.
   They will meet with Bill Humphrey in the next week to give his perspective on the project. We have until February 2026 to have it completed and the reimbursement request submitted.
- Security Grant Resolution it is necessary for the Board to approve the resolution in order to accept the Grant Funds for the new Security Fence. A motion was presented by Louis Marx and seconded by Steve Weintraub:

WHEREAS, The Temple Shalom Board of Trustees finds it in the best interest of the citizens of Dallas, Texas that the Target Hardening be operated for 2023; and WHEREAS, Temple Shalom Board of Trustees agrees to provide applicable matching funds for the said project as required by the Nonprofit Security Grant Program grant application; and WHEREAS, Temple Shalom Board of Trustees agrees that in the event of loss or misuse of the Office of the Governor funds, Temple Shalom Board of Trustees assures that the funds will be returned to the Office of the Governor in full.

WHEREAS, Temple Shalom Board of Trustees designates the Project Director as the grantee's authorized official. The authorized official is given the power to apply for, accept, reject, alter or terminate the grant on behalf of the applicant agency.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Temple Shalom Board of Trustees approves submission of the grant application for the Target Hardening to the Office of the Governor.

The motion to approve the resolution passed unanimously.

### **Fundraising Update – Theresa Myers**

Golf Tournament Update. The gross total for funds raised by the Golf Committee and the Board was over \$79,000. With expenses to date, not including the donation to Children's Health, the net is \$65,000. The Golf Tournament committee is meeting on November 14<sup>th</sup> and will determine the donation amount to our beneficiary. Of note, the silent auction brought in \$15,000 which is more than we've ever done. Yasher Koach to the hardworking committee and this entire board.

## OnBoard Grant - Debra Levy Fritts

- Debra Levy Fritts and Theresa Myers have been gathering a list of members to solicit in order to meet our \$50,000 OnBoard matching grant goal.
- David Lamden shared that our communications work with regard to the OnBoard Grant is gearing back up. He and Diane Laner are gathering quotes for the communications work we want to do, realistically knowing that 100% of funds have not yet been raised.
- A motion was presented by Debra Levy Fritts and seconded by Theresa Myers: I move to authorize the
  president to contract for communications consultant services consistent with the OnBoard grant using
  OnBoard funds.
- The motion passed, Louis Marx abstained.

## **Garden Report – Gretchen Reynolds**

- Gretchen Reynolds gave brief history of the Garden Project and lifted up their four values: Education, Ecology, Wellness and Food Justice
- We are in the midst of a \$75K expansion and an evaluation process has begun to find a suitable strategic partner.
- The Garden Committee is holding a "November Big Build." There is much work to get done ahead of our big celebration. A link to sign up was emailed to you this evening. Of note: during Thanksgiving week there will be lots of opportunities to work with three different times available each day (except Thursday).
- Garden Dedication and Celebration will be held on December 10<sup>th</sup> at 12:30pm. Please plan to attend.

## Executive Director's Report - David Lamden

- Security is David's top priority, and he is in talks with Bill Humphries and networking with other Executive Directors around the country. There are changes to security that people can see and some they won't see. Feel free to reach out to him with questions or concerns.
- David will be attending the NATA conference in Charlotte and will be facilitating workshops around security. He appreciates the Board's support of his attendance at this important gathering.
- We continue talks with the JCC regarding future partnerships.

- The Staff Holiday Celebration has been run by the Executive Committee in the past, and David is proposing to take that stress off the Executive Committee by taking over that responsibility.
- A motion was presented by Renee Roth and seconded by Barry Brown: I move to authorize the Executive Director to spend up to \$350 for the staff celebration from the Employee Appreciation Dedicated Fund.
- The motion passed unanimously, and the event be held on December 13<sup>th</sup>.
