This week we leaned into our value of holy community/kehillah kedosha with our first monthly buddy session between 7th graders and their Pre-K and K buddies. Please encourage your children to fill those beautiful tzedakah boxes they made and bring the funds to our beautiful tzedakah box outside the Lifelong Learning office. Each month 7th grade will be encouraging us to donate funds to a specific organization. Ask your 7th graders about the conversation they had about tzedakah.



Our 1st and 2nd graders began their study of creation. Be sure to ask them about what was created each day!

3rd-6th grade focused on why we orient our bodies and hearts towards Jerusalem. Some special artwork came home this week, 5th and 6th grade parents can expect to see that artwork next week - they got so carried away in conversation they didn't have time to finish! Be sure to ask them about the Hebrew word for East and why we want to remember which direction is East.

This week we look forward to welcoming parents and even more young learners for our first Tots Academy class! Feel free to stay after class to attend Hebrew through Movement or a special pre-reader worship service.

K through 2nd grade will be focusing on the High Holy Days, 3rd-6th grade will be learning about Israel in our prayers and 7th grade will be preparing to LEAD High Holy Day worship and engaging in new mitzvot. Each week our 7th graders perform at least one mitzvah of gemilut chasadim/loving kindness. Please check in with them each week to see what they have been up to!
